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The Complex – Program Overview

Indoor Sports Facility

- 120,000 SF
- Multi-purpose courts can be converted to 10 basketball courts, 16 volleyball courts, 30 pickleball courts, turf, etc.
- F&B (concessions, bar, restaurants)
- Fitness center
- One ice rink
- Leasable space (medical, physical therapy, etc.)
- Stem Education / eSports Center
- Community Learning Center

Athletic fields & CSA Academy

- 6 multi-sport artificial turf fields
- Soccer, flag football, lacrosse, field hockey, etc.
- ▶ F&B Pad ~6,000 12,000 SF
- +/- 800 parking spaces



The Complex – Program Overview

Community use of the facilities

- Community Learning Center
- Stem education center
- Neighborhood access to facilities on nonevent days
- 5,500 proposed hours of community programming
- Multiple food & beverage options
- Select cultural & arts events/festivals

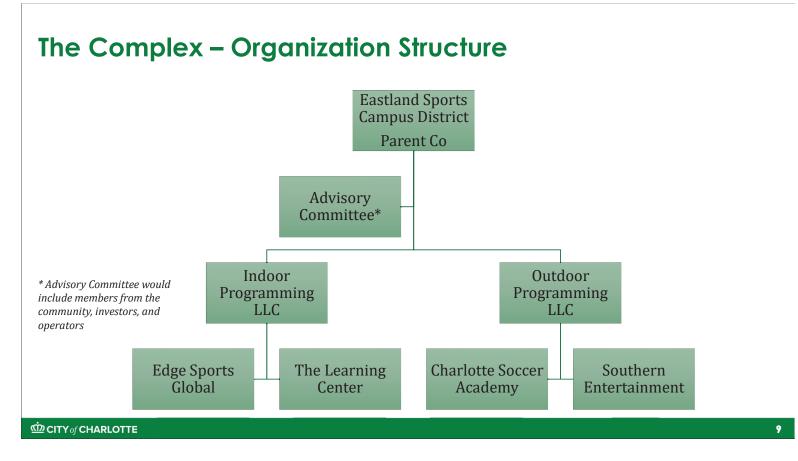


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October Council Action

- A. Endorse revised proposal and authorize Staff to move forward with the "new" team
- **B.** Approve up to \$30 million for reimbursement of expenses associated with public infrastructure improvements and the indoor/outdoor amateur sports facilities as outlined in the resolution adopted by Council on June 12

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The Complex – Indoor/Outdoor Amateur Sports Programming

Assess indoor & outdoor sports programming

- Size and indoor layout requires additional analysis to determine more defined cost estimates
 - Healthcare tenant(s)
 - Nonprofit community learning center

Hospitality funding

- Combining programming elements fields AND indoor facility
- Finalize reimbursable improvements
- Revised cost estimates determined upon completion of further analysis
 - Programming and tenant mix of indoor facility impacts the pro forma and public/private funding allocation



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The Complex – Infrastructure Analysis

Assessing infrastructure needs

• Strong coordination with the CSE team required to ensure scope alignment and accounting for all necessary infrastructure improvements

Infrastructure funding reimbursement

- Retaining walls
- Grading for larger program
- Water & sewer line installation & realignment
- Streets/streetscape

Cost increase from recent \$10 million allocation

• Higher intensity of programming causes more strain on site

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Next Steps

- Continuing analysis required to determine scope for infrastructure improvements and receive updated cost estimates
 - Collaboration with Crosland Southeast team on scope and schedule

Indoor and outdoor amateur sports building and site programming

- Building layout, size, and potential tenants
- Allocation of hospitality funds (e.g. what will be reimbursed?)

Collaboration to ensure logistical efficiencies

- Update City Council Q1 2024
 - · Potential request for additional public investment
 - Refined development schedule & future updates to City Council

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
