NIBIN, ballistic intelligence, and ATF partnerships to connect shootings, solve cases, and reduce gun violence.

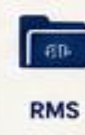

- Sheriff
- City Council
- Director of Health and Human Services
- Community Supervision Executive (Adult Corrections)
- Community Partners

IMPORTANT

All partners must agree to comply with 8 U.S.C. §§ 1373 (a) and (b) and 1644, including the prohibitions on certain actions by state and local government entities, agencies, and officials regarding information on citizenship and immigration status to receive funds.
