Savona Mill

528 South Turner Avenue



The Savona Mill shows the evolution of industrial architecture with three distinct periods of 20th century industrial construction techniques and materials: the Weave Mill (c. 1916), a 1-story brick building of traditional timber mill construction with exposed beam ends and a wood clerestory roof; the Spinning Mill (c. 1921), a 3-story adjoining brick building of iron/timber fireproof construction with poured concrete foundation, timber beams and floors, and metal columns; and the Paper Warehouse (c. 1951), a 3-story adjoining brick building of reinforced concrete framed construction with concrete mushroom columns and brick infill walls. Originally constructed for the Savona Manufacturing Company, the building was leased in 1931 to Alfred Cotton Mills and sold later in the 1930s to Old Dominion Box Company. The building was actively used for manufacturing until the 1990s when Old Dominion ceased production at the property. The red shaded area below indicates the general location of the approximately 3.168-acre portion of tax parcel ID no. 07111417 recommended for designation. A more detailed plat of the parcel (identifying the portion recommended for designation as "Area 138,003 Sq. Ft 3.168 Acres") is also included below.
