Catherine Simmons / Lincoln Heights

- Partnerships with neighborhood associations
- New affordable homeownership development
- Enhanced foot and bike patrols to build community rapport
- Enhanced enforcement on vacant properties
- Evaluate opportunities for redevelopment, including Acquisition, Rehab, Resell
- Partner with Mecklenburg County to enhance the safety and appearance of Lincoln Heights Park
- Coordinate with CARES Team and community partners to support crisis response

Little Rock Apartments

- Partnership with INLIVIAN and CMPD to enhance safety and connect residents to community resources, with a focus on youth
- Secured a grant from Lowe's to revitalize the park at Little Rock Apartments, working with residents, MYEP ambassadors, an Alternatives to Violence staff to create a more inviting community space.
- Organized a youth Halloween event in partnership with local radio station 102.5 The Block, providing a safe and engaging environment for young people to celebrate the holiday.
- West Boulevard Alternatives to Violence Team staff are now on-site at Little Rock.

Illegal Parking in Bike Lanes and on Sidewalks



Harris Blvd./I-85




Street Lighting in Charlotte

- Enhances visibility for drivers, pedestrians, and bicyclists to see surroundings and avoid hazards.
- Prevents crashes by illuminating conflict areas.
- Provides sense of security for walking or biking at night.
- Improves emergency response times to locate an incident more quickly in a well-lit area.








Upgrading Existing Street Lights
