Background

On October 3, 2016, Charlotte City Council issued a letter to the community outlining goals for policing, housing and jobs to address issues and concerns expressed following the Charlotte demonstrations.

This Community Letter is about **everyone working together** – across all communities – to make Charlotte the best city for all.

For City Council, that means four things in particular:

- 1. Trust in community policing
- 2. Quality, affordable housing
- 3. Good jobs and the skills to get them
- Other opportunities: the community letter is just the beginning



Background

- CMPD launched the Community Empowerment Initiative (CEI) in 2017.
- CEI focuses on:
 - Conflict Resolution & Mediation,
 - Crime Fighting & Prevention,
 - Opportunities for Youth and/or Parents.
- Non-profit and community organizations have historically been active in the three CEI focus areas.
- Seed grants and capacity building support can extend the impact of these organizations, providing a greater return for our community.

Program Overview

- Grants up to \$500 focused on programming
- Organizations that serve a public good can apply for community-led projects in one of the CEI focus areas
- Applicants must:
 - Attend pre-application workshop (April 2018)
 - Submit completed application including project budget
 - Demonstrate project is connected to CEI themes
 - Complete the project by June 30, 2018

Program Overview (continued)

- Target Organizations:
 - Community-based
 - Annual operating budget less than \$100,000
 - Do not have to be a 501(c)3
- Housing & Neighborhood Services Neighborhood Training workshop opportunities

Next Steps

- Applications accepted on a rolling basis, starting April 3
- Awards will be made within 2 weeks of a completed and eligible application
- Projects must be competed by June 30, 2018
- Staff will evaluate applications as they are received
- Grantees will present their projects at a JumpStart
 Community Safety Expo in the fall
