Ordinances affected by S.L. 2021-138 (SB 300 - Criminal Justice Reform Act) which decriminalized most local ordinances beginning on December 1, 2021. Council must adopt revised ordinances by removing criminal enforcement where prohibited and by specifically adding it in the proposed sections to pursue the criminal fines and enforcement option, when applicable. Civil fines, citations and enforcement remain available for all City Code violations.
