

Albert Wallace Log House

9425 Robinson Church Road, Charlotte



The ca. 1825 Albert Wallace Log House is one of the few identified well-executed ante-bellum extant log houses in Mecklenburg County that is at its original location and which also exhibits the physical integrity required for historic landmark designation. There is sufficient circumstantial evidence to infer that enslaved people lived in the Wallace House before Emancipation. The Wallace House is important because of its place in the emergence of sharecropping as the principal agricultural labor system in rural Mecklenburg County in the post-bellum years. The Charlotte-Mecklenburg Historic Landmarks Commission is recommending that City Council adopt a resolution to hold a Public Hearing to consider landmark designation for the property.
