

Safe Communities	Comprehensive Plan Goal 1: 10-Minute Neighborhoods	Increase the percentage of households, both new and existing, within a 10-minute walk, bike, or transit trip of family sustaining wage jobs
	Strategic mobility plan: vision zero/safe	Collaborate across governmental agencies and community stakeholders focused on strategies for community engagement, data analysis, and equity: • create safe streets for all users • design for safety • plan for safety
	Violence Framework: Interrupt Violence	 This strategy recommends the creation for a violence interruption program. The program will employ and train Charlotteans with ties to specific neighborhoods to de-escalate situations before they turn violent. This focuses on: interrupting violence before it begins connecting individuals who present the highest risk for committing or becoming victims of violent crime to resources, services and opportunities changing community ideas around the normalization of violence
