Winston	<b>19. Exchange of Land Rights along the LYNX Light Rail Corridor with South End Owner LP</b>  Was this property reviewed to be used as affordable housing? What is the criteria or limit we use to determine if city-owned land can be used for affordable housing?	In accordance with the Council adopted Guidelines for Evaluation and Disposition of City Owned Land for Affordable Housing, based on site size and configuration, this property was not assessed to be feasible for use as housing due to the narrow dimensions of the property on the right of way.

Winston	<b>34. Construct Parkwood Avenue Streetscape Improvements Project</b>  Will this project include protected bike lanes?	Yes, this project includes protected bikes lanes.
Eiselt	<b>35. Design Northwest Division Police Station</b>  Do we use the same blueprint for every station?  Does every station have a community room, and have we found that they get used frequently by the public?	While each station has similar components, the building layout is generally dependent on the footprint of the land.  All of our police stations are outfitted with community rooms. Usage varies and has been impacted by COVID restrictions, however usage is starting to pick back up and some Community Organizations use them to host their regular meetings.
