HOME – ARP Federal Stimulus Funding

Homelessness Assistance Plans

- 1 \$2M¹ approved by City Council [on December 6, 2021] in support of Charlotte Rescue Mission's overall capital campaign
 - · Enable expanded programming
- 2 Up to \$9.6M earmarked for 2025 Charlotte-Mecklenburg Homelessness Strategy, with RFP seeking responses in accordance with allowable uses under the federal rules:
 - · Tenant-Based Rental Assistance
 - · Production/Preservation of Affordable Housing
 - Purchase/Development of Non-Congregate Shelter for use as emergency shelter, permanent housing, or affordable housing
 - Supportive Services [e.g., homeless prevention services and housing counseling]

1 - Overall City of Charlotte support for Charlotte Rescue Mission reflects an additional \$2M funded by CARES-CDBG balance
