


What's Next: Alignment Rezoning

- Alignment Rezoning matches the new UDO zoning districts to the 2040 Policy Map place types
- It will <u>update the city's Official Zoning Map</u> which tells you:
 - What can be built
 - Where it can be built
 - How it can be built

Develop criteria to guide proposed zoning changes based

on Place Types and development context







A Joint Approach

- Coordinate two efforts to:
 - Match zoning with Community Area Plan recommendations for future development/redevelopment
 - Provide clarity for community about how the two efforts work together
 - Maximize community input and time & city resources
- Two-year, citywide effort with coordinated communications, engagement, and interdepartmental collaboration

Alignment Rezoning


- Recommendations for changes to the Zoning Map

- Changes to conditional districts will likely occur at a later phase


