Overview

Committee will consider Mobility position statement

- · Council did not come to agreement on Mobility
- Remaining positions discussed at Annual Strategy Session received "thumbs-up" and are in the Appendix
- Staff will utilize the January 23 Revised Position for those positions in the Appendix unless Committee wants to reconsider

Consideration of a motion to adopt committee-proposed legislative agendas

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Basis of Staff Recommendations

Reflects adopted city strategic plans and policies

Focused on issues that can attract support from leadership, administrations, delegation members, and stakeholders

Seeking out areas of alignment with Mecklenburg County, Charlotte Regional Business Alliance, and other partners, as appropriate

Position statements are drafted to reflect the unique circumstances faced by the city at the US Congress or NC General Assembly

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Four Additional Issues

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Homestead Tax Exemption

Mecklenburg County staff proposed inclusion in the County's 2023 Legislative Agenda to "support increasing the Homestead Act threshold to support older adults aging in place"

If recommended by Committee, suggested position statement:

Affordable Housing: Build affordable housing and provide opportunities that align with creating thriving neighborhoods and mitigating the impacts of displacement and gentrification

 Support increasing the Homestead Act threshold to support older adults aging in place

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Pretrial Services

Chief of Police has gained support across the State and from the NC Association of Chiefs of Police for this initiative

Initiative addresses:

- Persons accused of serious felonies must face Judge for pretrial release (list of serious crimes is on following page)
- Judge to set release conditions when defendants are arrested on new charges while already on pretrial release
- Extends the intervals between custody review hearing for juveniles charged with murder

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Pretrial Services

Serious crimes:

- · First or second-degree murder
- · Attempted murder
- · First degree burglary
- · First degree arson
- Robbery with a dangerous weapon
- Assault with a deadly weapon with intent to kill inflicting serious injury
- Discharging a firearm or barreled weapon into occupied property or conveyance in operation

- · Human trafficking
- First or second-degree kidnapping
- First or second-degree rape
- First or second-degree sexual offense
- Statutory rape of or sexual offense with a child by an adult
- First degree statutory rape or statutory rape or sexual offense with a person who is 15 years or younger

If recommended by Committee, add bullet to Safe Charlotte:

• Support legislation to strengthen accountability and reliability in the pretrial release system

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Commercial Truck Parking

NC Trucking Association is requesting that the State leverage federal funds to build new or expand existing rest area facilities for commercial trucks

Multi-departmental team led by CDOT Director is considering this and other quality of life issues

Recommend that the multi-departmental team be allowed to consider the impacts of these issues and make recommendations before the Committee acts

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Heirs' Property

Property that is passed from a deceased landowner to their next of kin without the benefit of a will

- If there are multiple heirs, they become tenants in common
- Single co-tenant may partition and sell their share of the property, without the concurrence of the other co-tenants
- In situations like this, heirs' property could be forcibly sold below market price
- Situations disproportionately impact people of color and low-incomes

2021 legislation was strongly opposed by State Senate leadership

Recommend not adding to the state agenda
