STEPS TAKEN SINCE DECEMBER

- Rejected bids for CMPD Northwest Police Station due to failure to meet MWSBE goals
- Supported citywide "Business Connections" networking event in April
- Shifted delivery methods from standard Design-Bid-Build to Construction Manager at Risk
 - CMPD Northwest Police Station
 - Firehouse #11 Replacement
 - Miranda Road Firehouse
 - ADA CMGC Phase II
- Shifted delivery method to Design-Build
 - CMPD Hangar Relocation
 - Solid Waste Services Transfer Stations
 - Animal Care & Control Phase III
 - Bryant Farms Road Extension
 (Rea Road to Audrey Kell Road) Phase II









ROAD TO GROWTH - GENERAL CIP PILOT FRAMEWORK

Note: Target market still under legal review

<\$300K

- Target MWSBEs
- No bid bond required
- Low administrative workload
- Often self-performing

\$300K - \$500K

- Target MWSBEs
- Bid bond required (bonding assistance available)
- Set utilization goals
- Moderate administrative workload
- Subcontracting may be needed

\$500K - \$5M

- Open competition
- Bid bond required (bonding assistance available)
- Set utilization goals
- Full administrative workload
- Mix of subcontracting and selfperforming

>\$5M

- Projects evaluated for Alternative Delivery
- Goals are determined based on project and delivery method

Total value: approx. \$5.7M

5 projects

Total value: approx. \$1.9M

29 projects

Total value: approx. \$45M

13 projects

Total value: approx. \$217M

Federal or State Funded Projects

Projects with Federal and State funding shall follow DBE processes and rules



CIP PILOT PROJECTS

Pilot Time Frame: June - September







UPCOMING PROJECTS FOR FUTURE AWARD

• The projects listed below ranging from \$500K to \$5M in construction costs are anticipated for future award within the next 6 months

Examples include:

- Sardis Road N (Sardis Rd. to Rittenhouse Circle) Sidewalk
- Monroe Road Multi-Use Path
- Charlotte Solar Photovoltaic Initiative Phase III

- CMPD Boathouse
- River District Phase I Firehouse

Projects at or near 100% design but greater than \$5M that also need to move forward

Examples include:

- McCullough Drive Streetscape
- Prosperity Church Road (Old Ridge to Benfield) Improvements
