Purpose of the Action Plan

- City of Charlotte's Application for federal grant funds
- Plan and process to create a unified vision for housing and community development activities
- Strategy to carry out HUD's program
- Basis for assessing local performance



Goals of the Action Plan

To Create:

- Decent Housing
- Suitable Living Environment
- Expand Economic Opportunity







Approval Process

- Provide public forums for citizen input
- Publish draft documents and receive written comment
- Hold a public hearing
- Receive Council approval and submit to HUD



Community Development Block Grant

- Decent housing and suitable living environment
- Expands economic opportunities, principally for low and moderate income persons
- Used for relocation, housing rehabilitation, afterschool enrichment, and housing administration

Created in 1990, the HOME Program provides:

- Decent affordable housing to lower income households
- Expand the Capacity of nonprofit housing providers
- Leverage private sector participation

- Conversion, renovation, and the rehabilitation of homeless shelters
- Operation of homeless facilities
- Delivery of essential services and homelessness prevention
- Housing Relocation and Stabilization Services (Rapid Re-Housing)

Housing for People with Aids and HIV

 In FY2017 the City received \$2,165,680 to fund the above activities in the following counties: Cabarrus, Gaston, Iredell, Lincoln, Mecklenburg, Rowan, Union, and York Counties. HOWPA also services Chester and Lancaster County, SC.

Key FY17 Performance Results

- Constructed & Rehabilitated <u>538</u> affordable units (HOME & CDBG)
- Provided <u>212</u> households with temporary rental assistance (HOME)
- Served <u>625</u> children through After School Enrichment Program (CDBG)
- Assisted <u>4,628</u> persons through the Emergency Solution Grant Programs (ESG)
- Provided <u>261</u> families with downpayment assistance (HOME)
