The Grand FY2018 Budget Deal

- » President Trump and the Democratic Leadership agreed to a three month deal that would raise the debt ceiling, keep the federal government open and provide disaster aid for Hurricanes Harvey and Irma.
- » The Continuing Resolution and debt ceiling will expire on December 8th, 2017.
- » The President stated this allows time to move other important agenda items forward such as tax reform and infrastructure investment
- In the meantime, Congress will continue consideration of FY18 Appropriations Bills with the goal of passing an omnibus in December to keep the federal government open for the remainder of the fiscal year.

FALL CONGRESSIONAL OUTLOOK: Wish List

» Tax Reform

- Congressional tax writers issued joint statement on July 27, 2017 indicating move to drafting tax code overhaul.
- Infrastructure may be tied into tax overhaul.
- The Republicans, Democrats and the President are focused on some type of reform
- Private discussions are taking place on what the overall would look like
- Key concerns for local government:
 - Elimination of the deductibility of state and local property, income and sales taxes
 - Municipal Bonds
 - Estimated to raise over \$1 trillion in federal revenue
- H&K is working with the USCM's in partnership with the Big 7 local government associations to weigh in with Congress and the Trump Administration in an organized manner. Recently participated in a national call with stakeholders

Wish List Continued

» Infrastructure Package

- The President's budget request included \$200 billion in federal funds over a decade to incentivize state, local, and private-sector financing.
- The Administration and Congress have stated they are committed to a robust infrastructure package.
- Outlined principles for the infrastructure initiative:
 - Make Targeted Federal Investments
 - Encourage Self-Help
 - Align Infrastructure Investment with Entities Best Suited to Provide Sustained and Efficient Investment
 - Leverage the Private Sector
- Outlined transportation proposals:
 - Tolling on Interstates
 - Expand TIFIA
 - Expand Private Activity Bonds

Wish List Continued

- H&K has been working with the Trump Administration on what a package should include such as transit and water infrastructure projects.
- We have held discussions with the City's senior leadership on what types of projects we should be looking to submit.
- Some of the merit criteria that has been discussed:
 - National and regional economic vitality
 - Potential for innovation
 - Safety
 - Environmental Sustainability
 - Project delivery approach
 - Leveraging of federal funding
 - Performance and accountability

FAA Update

» Appropriations

Transportation

- Funding for air traffic control towers
- Air traffic noise issues
- UAS integration issues
- Homeland Security
- Increased CBP officer deployment
- Opposition to the elimination of exit-lane staffing by DHS
- Biometric exit program funding and development
- Reduction in Law Enforcement Officer (LEO) reimbursement program rates

FAA Update Continued

» FAA Reauthorization

- Funding for air traffic control towers
- Current authorization expires Sept. 30
- Extension is certain but how long?
- Airports requesting no less than six months to allow

FAA to make grants

- Regulatory reductions in grant programs
- UAS integration issues
- Removal of air traffic control functions from FAA
- Infrastructure Package
 - There is some thought that airport improvements may be included in any large package

• Other

- We continue we continue to keep abreast of personnel changes at USDOT, FAA, DHS, TSA and CBP
- Airport Perimeter security legislation
- AMT relief for private activity bonds (unlikely but monitoring)

Transit Update

- » Transit Funding
 - Capital Investment Grants Program
 - House \$1.753 billion
 - Senate \$ 2.133 billion
 - LYNX Blue Line Extension \$75 million in both bills
 - Formula Programs funded at FAST Act authorized levels
 - Bill and Report Language directing FTA to advance projects and request project funding in the FY19 Budget

OPPORTUNITIES FOR CHARLOTTE: Status of Federal Grants

» Grants

- **TIGER:** DOT released TIGER NOFA Outline September 6, 2017; requests are due on October 16
- H&K Team participated in the US DOT Webinar on the TIGER Grant to gain information and insight on a winning application
- \$500 million allocated to projects with a significant impact on the Nation, a metropolitan area or region.
- Special consideration to projects emphasizing better access to reliable, safe, and affordable transportation especially in rural areas.
- Bus and Bus Facilities Infrastructure Investment Program: FTA issued notice for the program, with approximately \$226.5 million in funding for transit bus projects. Eligible projects include those that seek to "replace, rehabilitate, lease and purchase buses and related equipment as well as projects to purchase, rehabilitate, construct or lease bus-related facilities, such as buildings for bus storage and maintenance." The program will fund a minimum of 10 percent (\$22.6 million) for rural bus needs. All applications must be submitted by August 25th, 2017.

Status of Federal Grants

» CBDG

- CDBG was funded at \$2.9 billion in the House bill, \$100 million below FY 2017 levels.
- We will monitor CDBG in the Senate.

» HOME

- HOME was funded at \$850 million, \$100 million below FY 2017 levels.
- We will monitor HOME in the Senate.
- The Continuum of Care: is designed to promote a community-wide commitment to the goal of ending homelessness; to provide funding for efforts by nonprofit providers, States, and local governments to quickly re-house homeless individuals, families, persons fleeing domestic violence, and youth while minimizing the trauma and dislocation caused by homelessness; to promote access to and effective utilization of mainstream programs by homeless; and to optimize self-sufficiency among those experiencing homelessness. City of Charlotte FY18 Federal Legislative Agenda Update

- » Charlotte Airport Control Tower Worked with Rep. Alma Adam's office to make sure there was appropriate funding in FY18 budget for tower funding.
- » 2030 Transit System Plan
 - FY18 is the last year of the Blue Line Full Funding Grant Agreement
 - We worked with Rep. Alma Adams Office and Senator Burr to make the request for funding in this fiscal year Appropriations THUD Bill.
 - The H&K Team has been very engaged with the White House and US DOT in helping to formulate a robust infrastructure program. As well as participating in discussions with the City of Charlotte staff to convey what we are hearing and identifying strong projects.
- » North End Smart District We continue to monitor funding opportunities for the smart district.
- Doppler Weather Radar Holland & Knight was very engaged in supporting Senator Burr and Representative Pittenger and other Members of the delegation in helping to pass legislation to secure a federal Doppler Weather Radar Facility that meets the public safety needs in the Charlotte region. We are happy to report that through this effort, President Trump signed the Weather Research and Forecasting Innovation Act of 2017. This important piece of legislation requires that the National Weather Service conduct a study and provide a solution to the weather radar gap in the region.
- » Municipal Bonds We continue to monitor this issue, particularly as the Trump Administration and the Congress begins to tackle tax reform.
