

**RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR A PUBLIC HEARING
ON APPLICATION FOR ERECTION OF PUBLIC MONUMENT**

WHEREAS, the City Council has received an application from the National Society of the Daughters of the American Colonists for the erection of a public monument in the form of a plaque to be placed in Old City Hall with inscription to read "Charlotte, the Queen City, established by act of legislature December 3, 1767. Named in honor of Queen Charlotte of Mecklenburg – Streilitz, Germany, wife of George III of England. Three hundred sixty acres of original tract was conveyed on January 15, 1767 from Henry E. McCulloch, Agent of George Augustus Selwyn, one of the first landowners in the country, to Abraham Alexander, Thomas Polk, and John Frohock, representatives of the city-to-be. Erected by the North Carolina Society of the Daughters of the American Colonists. Mrs. John Scott Welborn, State Regent, March 30, 1937. Originally erected 30 March 1937. North Carolina Society Daughters of American Colonists. Restoration Erected March 2018, John Lawson, Surveyor General Chapter, Daughters of American Colonists."

WHEREAS, the City Council deems it to be in the public interest that a public hearing be held on said application.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina, that a public hearing will be held in the Meeting Chamber of the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Government Center, 600 East Fourth Street, beginning at 6:30 p.m. on Monday, December 11, 2017, on the application for erection of a public monument.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that notice of said hearing be published as required by law.
