

Code Enforcement Action at Lake Arbor Apartments Update

Code Enforcement Inspections

- Since the City's involvement with Lake Arbor, 130 housing units have been brought into compliance with the Minimum Housing Code. Code continues to monitor the remaining 193 units with open cases.
- All units cited for infestation have been treated by a licensed professional as of November 5th
- 9 households have been referred to the Voluntary Emergency Relocation Housing Program
- 4 cases are scheduled on the March 5, 2019 Environmental Court docket

Resident - Ownership Engagement

- November 5: City staff conducted door-to-door survey to identify needs and services deemed most valuable to residents
- November 30: Community Meeting/Resource Fair in response to survey feedback
 - 17 residents in attendance
 - Staff update on repairs, as well as various responsibilities
