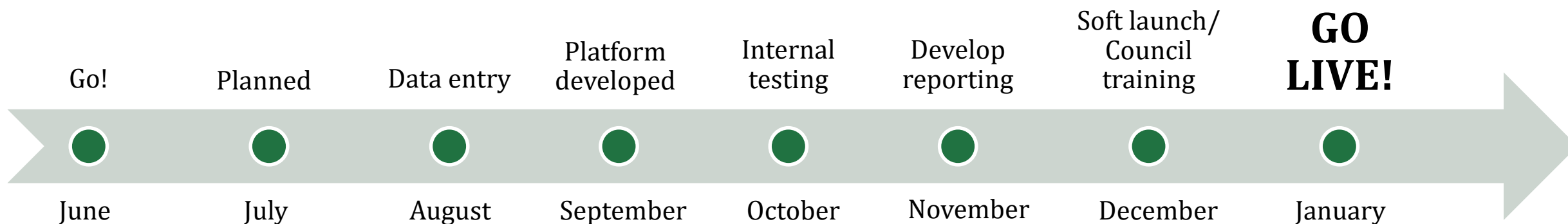
# WHAT IS CHARLOTTE'S DASHBOARD?

**What:** An interactive data and map tool to explore active capital projects

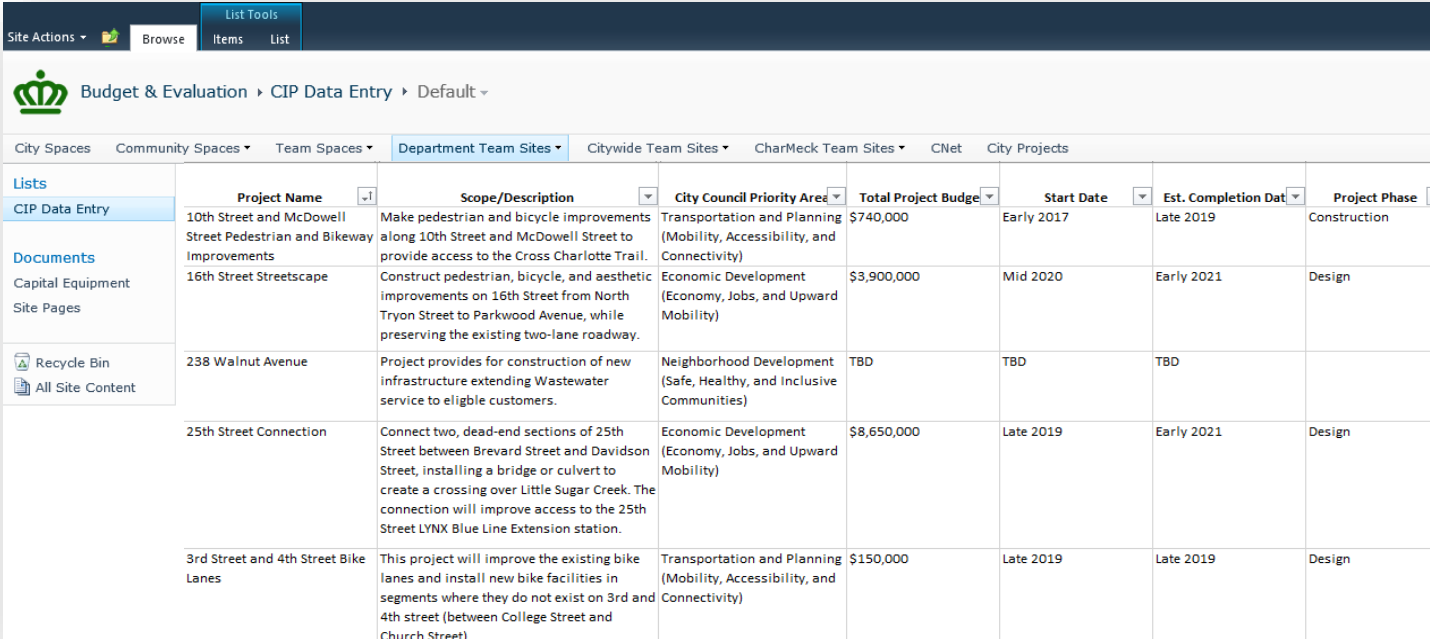
**Who:** All city departments

  - Link to website

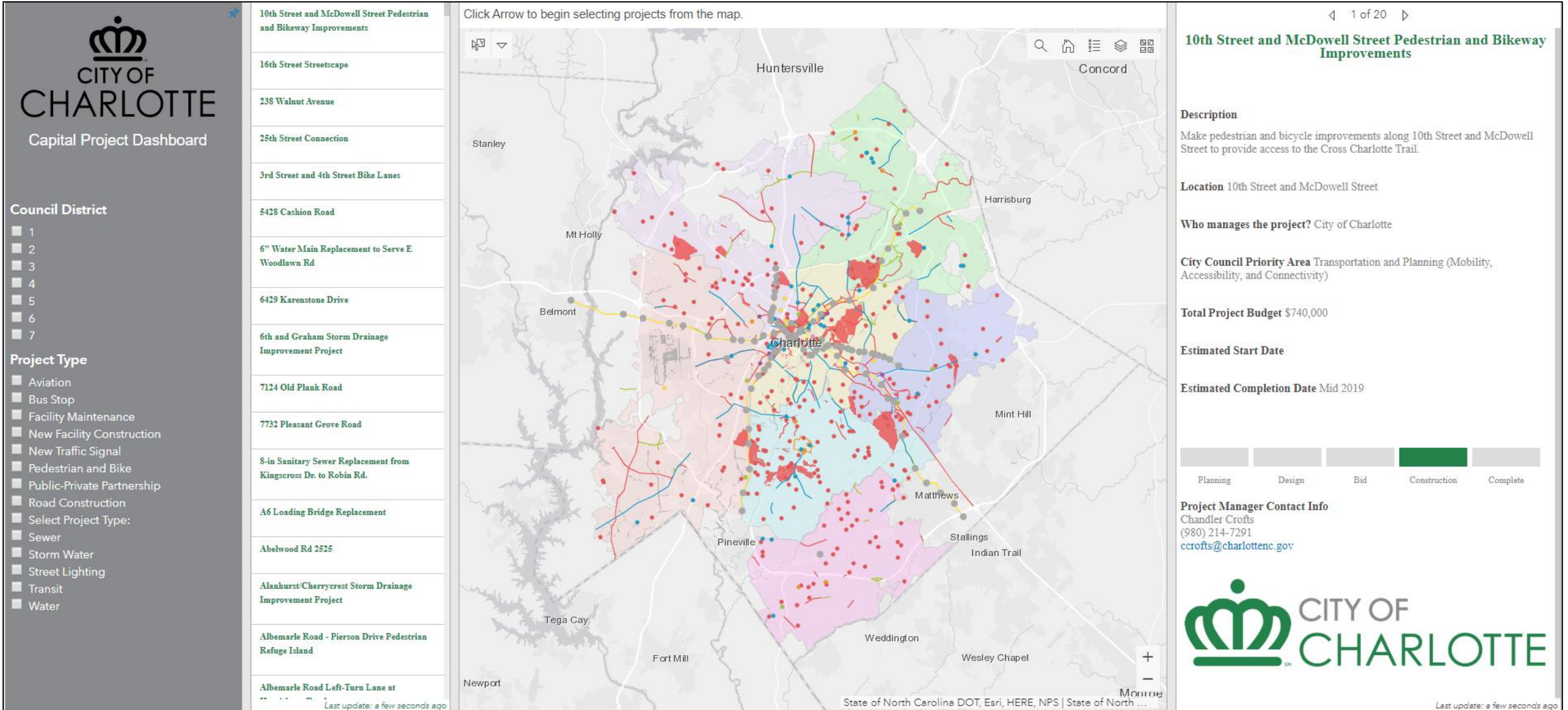

## Phase I (September 2019)

- Collect data from all departments ✓
- Establish dashboard framework and editing platform ✓

## Phase II (December/January) **GO LIVE!**

- Create home page and further refine dashboard aesthetic →
- Develop printable reporting feature →
- Data consistency and standardization →
- Planned soft launch and user sessions with City Council in early December
- Planned public promotion and roll-out with the New Year

## Phase III

- Continue verification and standardization of data across departments
- Automate project data from project management software to dashboard

## Phase IV

- Build mobile application with QR codes on project information signs
- Initiate electronic update notices
