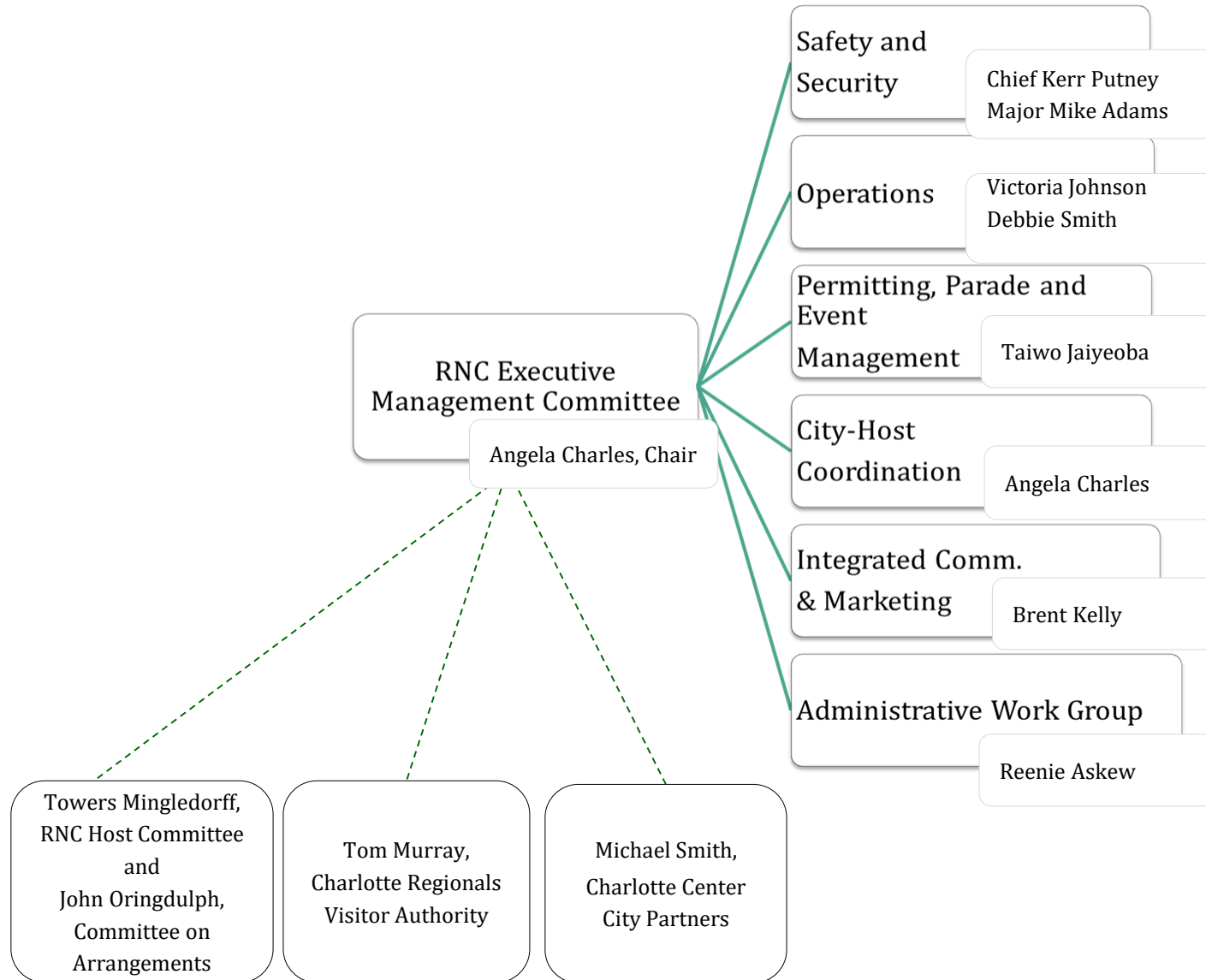

COMMITTEE STRUCTURE



- Recruitment – officer commitments going well
- CMPD Ambassador group is growing
- First hotel and equipment contracts underway
- BJA Grant submitted on January 15
 - \$50M budget and requested waivers needed
- Security perimeter continues to be revised
 - Joint effort between CMPD and U.S. Secret Service

- PWOC (Public Works Operations Center) location confirmed; plan in process
- Private deployment of small cell (primarily 5G) in Uptown is scheduled for completion by March
- Street resurfacing and sidewalk grinding repairs scheduled for March – June
- CLT Water completing hydrant testing and large meter maintenance in the coming months

- Committee focusing on three areas:
 - Zoning
 - Construction
 - Events
- Focus on parade permitting process
- Determine use of park space and facilities

 - Includes Waze map with street closures, information and links on obtaining permits, links to submit an open records request, and links to our city partners

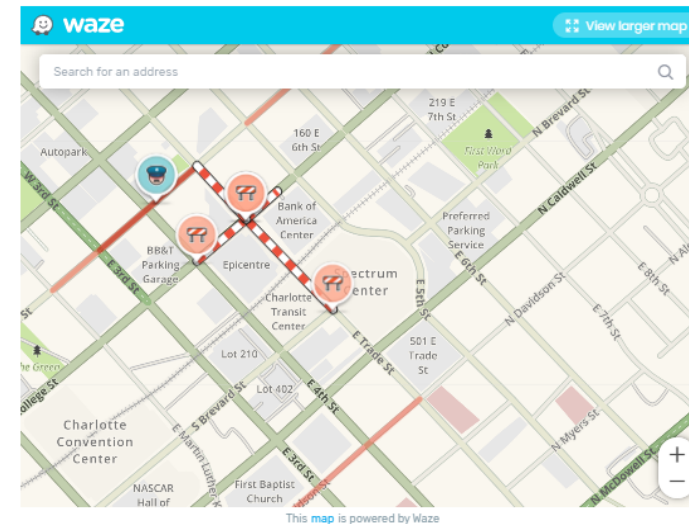
Frequently Asked Questions

Street Closures

Permits

Activities taking place in the right of way often require a permit. Organizations wanting to use amplified sound, temporarily (more than five minutes and less than 30 days) occupy a traffic lane, planting strip or sidewalk within the public right of way must obtain a permit. Each request is considered on a case-by-case basis to ensure there is no adverse impact to public safety.
