







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Goals of CARES Act Funds for City Operations


RESPOND


Protect employees and the public while attempting to mitigate service impacts


ADAPT

Reduce the burden on taxpayers for preparing how government will operate in the future

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New Guidance: FEMA Reimbursement

Costs eligible for reimbursement

- Costs incurred since emergency declaration
- Overtime and PPE related to COVID-19 response

⊲Identified \$3.5 million in eligible reimbursements to date

- Accounts for time period between the emergency declaration and end of FY 2020
- Future budget ordinance may be requested based on the duration of the emergency declaration

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Freeing Up Capacity of CARES Act

Additional CARES Act capacity enables city to:

- Support community-focused initiatives that fall outside the scope of the Recovery Task Forces
- Form timely, strategic partnerships
- Better connect the community to resources and services
- Meet a demonstrated need, worsened by COVID-19

Proposed two initiatives:

- Bridging the Digital Divide \$1.5 million
- Youth and Teen Opportunity Centers Up to \$2.0 million

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Bridging the Digital Divide

¬With COVID-19 we are more reliant on access to internet.

- · Accelerating smart cities work already underway, including public wi-fi
- · Building on Digital Alliance with Microsoft

Strategically leverage public wi-fi with existing city efforts

- Cross-department team has identified pilot locations to launch public wi-fi within Corridors of Opportunity geography
- · Expected launch date for first series of pilots is early fall
- · Lessons learned will be used to scale public wi-fi throughout the city

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Youth and Teen Opportunities

¬Many youth summer opportunities are impacted by COVID-19.


- Reduced availability to meaningful jobs, mentorship and skill development
- Reduced in-person activities and opportunities for supplemental meals

- Youth and teen programming
- Job skills training
- Evening enrichment opportunities
- Providing meals to participating youth
