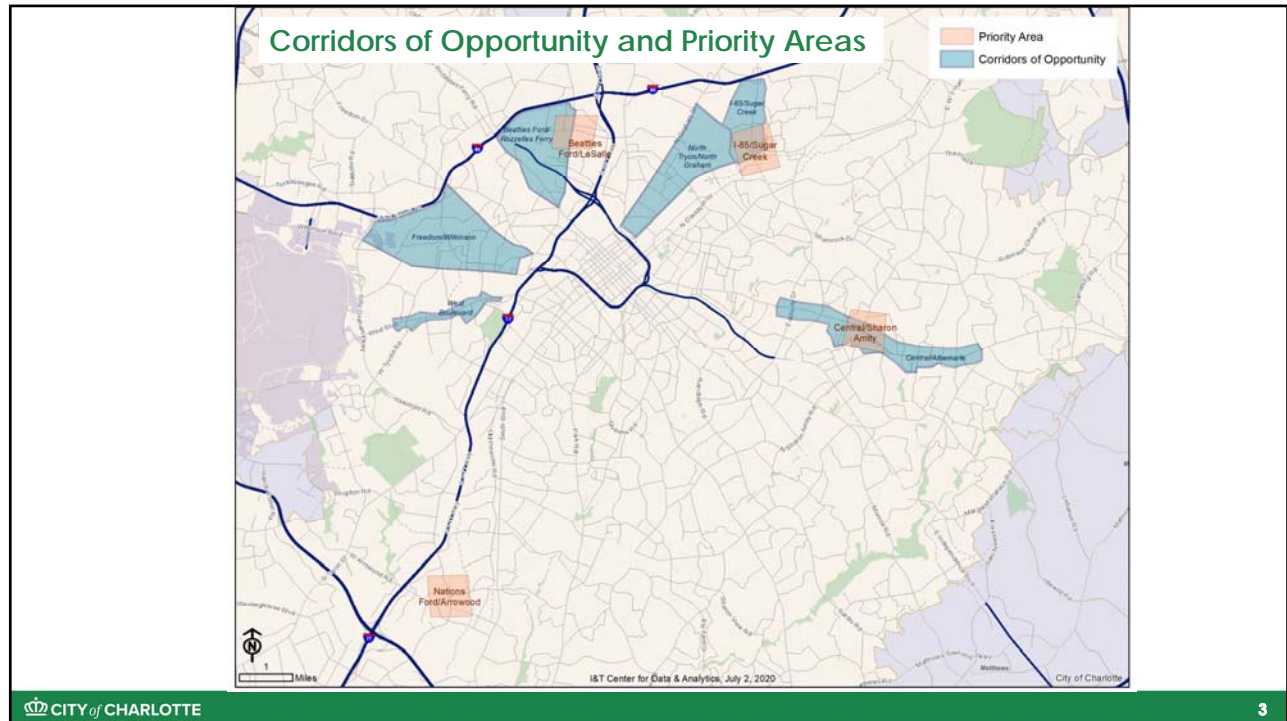

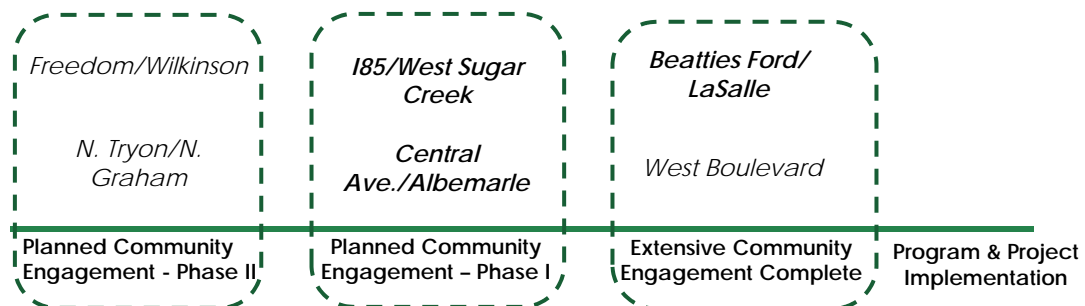

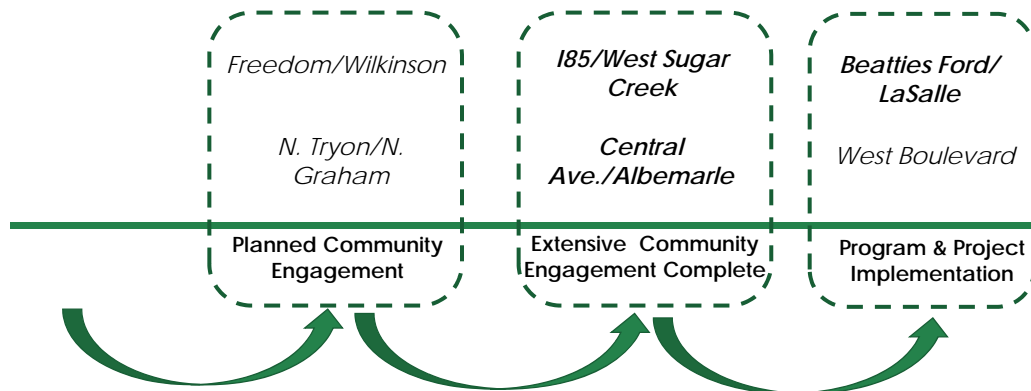


Corridor Continuum – Where We Started



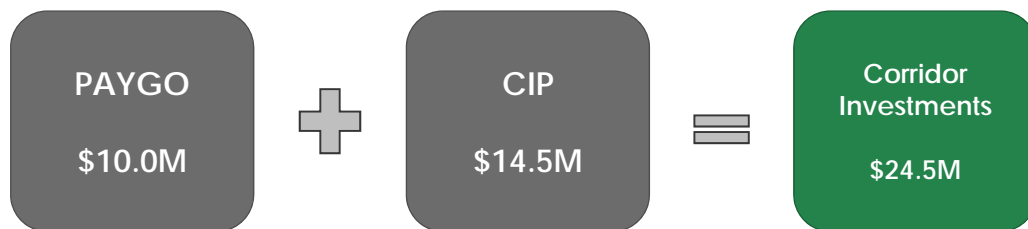
*Corridors in **bold** include identified priority areas. The fourth priority area, Nations Ford and Arrowwood Road, is not in an identified Corridor of Opportunity.

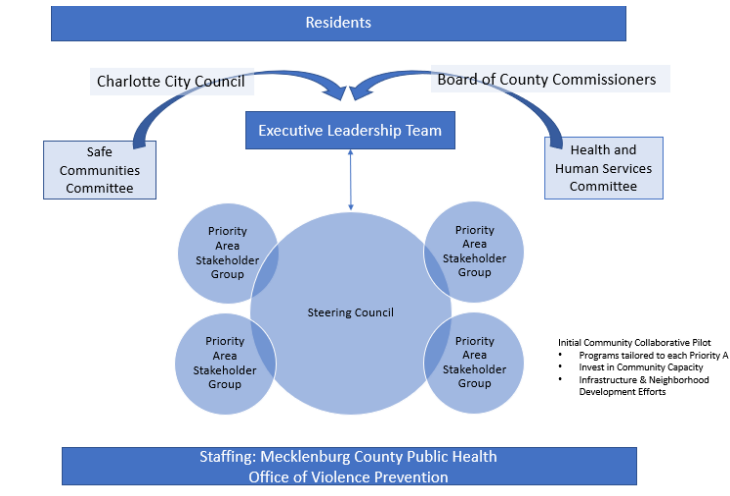

Intergovernmental Collaboration



Interrupt Violence

- ◀ Identified Jump Start funds for this effort
- ◀ Exploring key partnerships to stand up each of these two evidenced-based programs:

1) **Hospital-Based Violence Intervention**

Engaging violence victims in the hospital, during their recovery to receive assessment, counseling and social support in order to reduce recidivism

2) **Street Outreach Violence Interruption**

Outreach workers focus on people at highest risk of becoming involved with or victims of violence, and connect individuals with direct support services like conflict mediation, case management, mentoring etc.

- ◀ Launch pilot this Fall

Invest in Community-Led Efforts

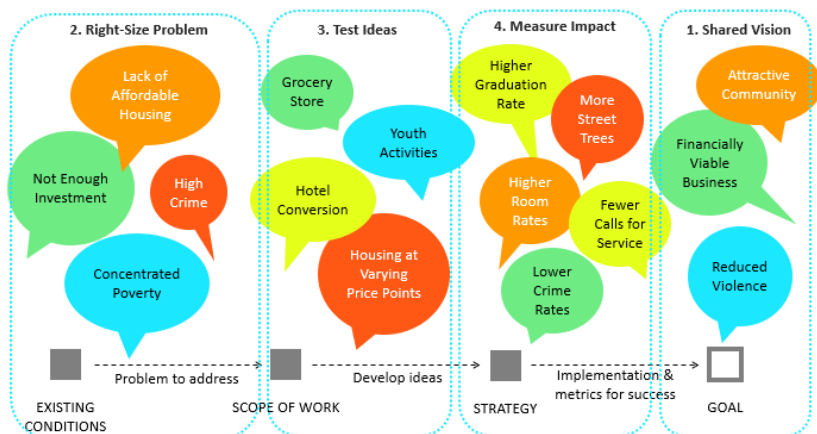
Street Outreach

- ◀ **Upward Mobility Fellowship** provides funding and resources to community-based organizers to address economic immobility and build infrastructure for organizing within their communities.
- ◀ Resource organizers living in neighborhoods experiencing economic immobility and heightened crime
- ◀ Launching this Fall

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Use Data and Evidence



- ◀ **Established inter-agency data sharing team, *the Violence Prevention Data Collaborative*** to do analysis, reporting and evaluation in support of community violence reduction, prevention, and intervention
 - Partnering with UNC Charlotte Urban Institute
- ◀ **Finalizing Violent Crime Dashboard** to publicly share violent crime-related information in a visual and easy to understand way
 - Led by Data Analytics team in partnership with CMPD
 - Launch in July
