Thank you for submitting the report for **Ashford House**, **241 Hoskins Dr.**, **Charlotte**, **Mecklenburg County**. We have reviewed the information in the report and offer the following comments in accordance with North Carolina General Statute 160D-946 (formerly 160A-400.6).

According to the report, the Ashford House is of local historical importance as the best, most intact house of two remaining examples of African American millworker housing at the Hoskins Cotton Mill in Charlotte.

We have shared recommendations with staff to perform changes to the report. The most notable of those suggests strengthening the boundary justification. The report overall, however, is excellent, was well-written, enjoyable to read, and makes a solid case for designation.

Landmark designation means the community recognizes properties within the historic district are worthy of preservation because of their special significance to the local community. Any substantial changes in design, materials, and appearance to these properties is subject to the design review procedures of the preservation commission.

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the report. Please note, our comments are advisory only and therefore, non-binding. Once the governing board has received a recommendation from the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Historic Landmarks Commission, it should proceed in the same manner as would otherwise be required for an amendment to the zoning ordinance.
