A Resolution to Call for a Public Hearing to Consider Designating the Larkwood-Chadbourn Hosiery Mill Plant (451 Jordan Place) as a Local Historic Landmark



The Larkwood-Chadbourn Hosiery Mill Plant (c. 1929) is historically significant for its association with two of Charlotte's largest and longest-operating hosiery producers, Larkwood Silk Hosiery Mills (1929-1945) and Chadbourn Inc. (1945-1978). Once the headquarters for one of the country's leading hosiery producers, the two-story brick mill is also architecturally significant as one of the few extant early-20th-century Charlotte industrial buildings featuring Art Deco stylistic elements. The property includes a one-story brick boiler house (c. 1949) and a freestanding brick smokestack (c. 1949).
