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UDO Advisory Committee (OAC)

ORIGINS and BACKGROUND


- Volunteer committee created in late-2016 in order to provide feedback to City staff in the development of the Unified Development Ordinance
- 30 original members, appointed by the Interim Planning Director, representing a variety of interests (e.g., Design, Land Development, Housing, and Sustainability)
- Initial membership included neighborhood representatives from around the city
- New members have been added over time to replace members who have resigned or moved
- 12 of the 30 original members (including Chair Tony Lathrop) are still active today on the OAC

- OAC meeting recordings may also be viewed on the YouTube channel and the CharlotteUDO.org website








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Phase 3 UDO Concept Review

- OAC feedback and questions are addressed during the meetings by staff and consultants via Zoom chat and live discussions. An online survey is sent to all OAC members after each meeting requesting written feedback and questions relevant to the meeting topics.

 - UDO Zoning articles (sections)
 - Natural Resources articles (including Trees)
 - Subdivision, Streets, and Infrastructure articles
 - UDO Administration (pending)





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OAC Role Going Forward




- The OAC will remain active and engaged in an advisory role even after the release of the draft UDO they helped develop.
