Stafford-Holcombe Farm

Plaza Road Extension, Charlotte North Carolina





The Stafford-Holcombe Farm possesses special historical and architectural significance in Charlotte and Mecklenburg County due to its retention of an early 19th-century one-story, hewn-log slave quarter-tenant house, the only identified extant slave quarters in Mecklenburg County. The timber-framed main house (c. early 1800s) retains significant original interior elements including plaster and vertical-board walls, wide wood ceiling boards, millwork, carved mantels, and enclosed wood stairs. The property is also significant for its agricultural function from the late 18th through the mid-20th centuries, and the historic main house, slave quarter-tenant house, and overall 27.78-acre parcel contribute to the farm landscape and the historic integrity of the unique built environment.
