LYNX North and West Corridor Alternative Analysis and Center City Integration Study

Action:

Approve the professional services contract in an amount not to exceed \$3,200,000 with WSP USA Inc., for the LYNX North and West Corridor Alternative Analysis and Center City Integration Study.

Explanation

- On March 3, 2017, the City issued a Request for Proposals; four proposals were received from interested service providers.
- A multi-disciplinary team, including representatives from the towns of Cornelius, Davidson, Huntersville and representatives from CDOT, Aviation, Planning and CATS evaluated the firms based on qualifications, and selected WSP USA Inc.
- The studies will:
 - Define the rapid transit alignments for the North and West Corridors,
 - Finalize the modal technology (i.e. Light Rail, Commuter Rail, Streetcar, etc.) for both corridors,
 - Update how the corridors will integrate with the existing LYNX Blue Line, CityLYNX Gold Line, and bus services, including the future Charlotte Gateway Station and LYNX Silver Line,
 - Provide preliminary cost estimates to build the remaining 3 rapid transit corridors in the 2030 Transit Corridor System Plan.
- A proactive public engagement process will be used to inform the community and address any concerns. The study will take approximately 18 months with an anticipated completion date of December 2018.
