## Public Hearing on a Resolution to Close Newell Farm Road

#### Action:

A. Conduct a public hearing to close Newell Farm Road, and

#### B. Adopt a resolution and close Newell Farm Road.

#### Explanation

- NC General Statute Section 160A-299 outlines the procedures for permanently closing streets and alleys.
- The Charlotte Department of Transportation (CDOT) received a petition to abandon public right-ofway and requests this City Council action in accordance with the statute.
- The proposed action removes land from public right-of-way and attaches it to the adjacent property.
- The road to be closed is located in Council District 4.

#### Petitioner

#### **Right-of-Way to be Abandoned**

Newell Farm Road

#### Reason

Per the petition submitted by Suncrest Real Estate & Land, the abandonment is a part of the site redevelopment, which will provide new infrastructure for access to the adjacent properties. The City has no objections.

#### Notification
