- North Carolina General Statute 160A-299 outlines the procedures for permanently closing streets and alleys.
- The Charlotte Department of Transportation received a petition to abandon public right-of-way and requests this City Council action in accordance with the statute.
- The action removes land from public right-of-way status and attaches it to the adjacent property.
- The attached resolution refers to exhibits and metes and bounds descriptions that are available in the City Clerk's Office.
- An alleyway off of W. 28th Street is located in Council District 1.

Right-of-Way to be Abandoned

The alleyway off of W. 28th Street is located northwest of the intersection of W. 28th Street and N. Tryon Street.
